Rapid Fire

New Targets

A series of remits are coming out relating to the new targets. There are a lot of extra things to sort out as well as just the target dimensions. Such as the logistics and timing of the change over, how the

grading will be dealt with over the transition period and what the % split across the grades will be after the transition. So please take the time to look at the target remits.

Encouraging the Participation of Junior Shooters at Opens.

While attending the Manawatu open, I had the opportunity to discuss this topic with several of those attending. I definitely had a problem regarding the cost of entry for the lower grades at the open. Several valid points were raised by some, one being that if the lower grade shooters were keen, then they would find the \$22 entry fee and attend regardless of the cost. That may be so, but I know of some D grade shooters who would have loved to participate, but they just could not afford it.

This brings me to my gripe regarding cost of entry. Do we want to encourage or discourage these (mostly) younger shooters from coming along to the opens, where they experience the atmosphere of competition and camaraderie, and where they learn of the enthusiasm of the other shooters towards the discipline of smallbore shooting.

Since this discussion, I have researched the costs of entry in D grade for some of the North Island opens, and it has been an interesting exercise.

- The dearest is Auckland, at \$25 (for all grades)
- Next is Manawatu, at \$22 (for all grades).
- Waikato comes in at \$20 (for all grades).
- Wanganui, Wellington, Wairarapa charged \$18

- for C & D grades.
- Marton charged just \$16 for C & D grades.
- Awahuri charged even less at \$10 for C & D grades.
- Hutt Valley charged \$10 for the D grade.

I don't have costs for all of the opens, but will be asking for them in the near future to compare with the figures compiled so far.

During the discussions about the entry fee being charged, I tried to reason that if the fee was more realistic for the D grade, then its the "bums on seats" scenario. With the results being that there would be more D grade shooters competing, thus the amount lost by lowering the fee would be offset by the extra shooters that could afford to participate. There may actually be more profit in it to be made by the association running the open.

A win win for all, as the kids actually get to shoot alongside the top competitors. What could be better than that, as it will encourage more participation in the future.

AND HAVING A FUTURE IS WHAT ITS ALL ABOUT.

Anyway, I may be wrong, but that's my 2 cents worth.

Kelly Burdon put up a 299.17 at the end of the day to not only take out B grade but also to earn a place in the final.

The Ngaio team was on fire in C and D grade with Charlotte Flanagan and Florian Virtosu taking out the grades respectively. The Ngaio club must be congratulated for the effort they put in for attending the opens.

After winning Master grade with a 300.20 Fiona McLeod went into the final in the lead. However with Kevin Small and Allison Archer and Robbie McNair all on 300 as well, it was going to be a close final. In the end Ryan Taylor slipped in from behind with the only 200 to take the Open championship from Fiona by 4 centrals with a grand total of 499.39.

The air rifle shooters could be heard now and then upstairs when there was break in the shooting. Owen Bennett stormed home in the Mens with 679.3. Fiona was having a good weekend, as she had a lead before going into the womens final and held the lead to win.

The teams event was taken out by Upper Hutt, with Dannevirke second. It must be noted that Rongotea No 2 beat the no 1 team, albeit by one point.

The pairs were a great demonstration on how the handicaps can work. Jeanette and Max Kinsey took out first place with the Ngaio pair and C & D grade winners Charlotte Flanagan and Florian Virtosu coming in second. Another couple Robbie and Ruth McNair was third (and the first Master grade pairing)

As organiser of the event I am aware that it takes a bit for this open to happen and my thanks goes out the many Manawatu helpers though out the day.

Division 1

This week Waikato had the best score of the round which gave them a good win over The Plainsmen with a 5022 total. 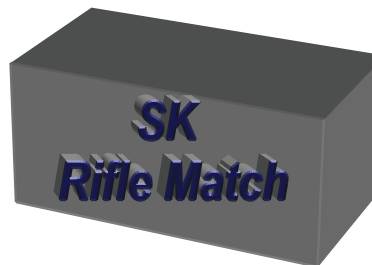
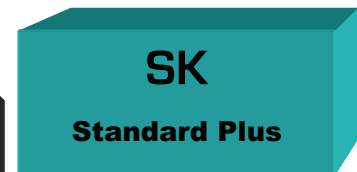
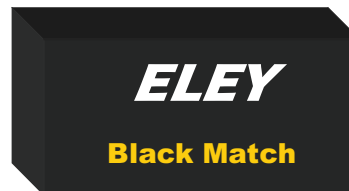
